Playground Re-development

The playground re-development work started in early December, so did the wet weather!

The contractors worked tirelessly in the most awful conditions to get the groundwork done and the new equipment in place.

Unfortunately, due to the inclement weather this did result in the playground looking like a scene from a battlefield, and accordingly the Parish Council, as previously advised, took the decision not to open the playground until it had dried up enough for the contractors to rework the ground. January and February continued to be very wet so it was early March before groundworks could be contemplated. The bare soil will be re-worked and seeded hopefully before the end of March.

The new swing and wheelchair accessible roundabout have both been placed within the new safety matting. The old swings, and the slide equipment will be repainted before the playground opens and the wooden toddlers area will also have a few running repairs also carried out.

The swing seats will be replaced, and a new toddlers rocker will be installed.

The new pedestrian access gate, which is self-closing, will keep loose dogs out of the playground, and residents are reminded that dogs are not allowed within the playground.

All this has been possible through the fundraising. Thank you all again.



Saint Peter's Church

At St Peters we ended 2023 with some very enjoyable services. It was lovely to welcome Aston School choir to our Carol Service, along with their parents. The school also used the Church for their own Carol Service and Communion was held on Christmas Day.

Our regular Communion service continues to alternate between the 3 churches in the Parish – Aston, Little Leigh and Lower Whitley. The Service rota is posted on each of the Church noticeboards but if in any doubt, please contact the Church Warden – Karen Sandiford (01928 715661).

We still have a vacancy for a Church Warden, so if you are interested in helping to support St Peters, please come forward – it is a very rewarding role.

We have just recently celebrated Rev Collette's 10th anniversary in the parish – hard to believe where this time has gone!

"Garden Savings" will start cutting the grass again during March, to ensure easy access to the graveyard and hopefully this will flatten the mole hills which keep appearing!

We continue to collect food and cleaning items for Runcorn Foodbank from across the parish and the whole congregation has been very generous with their donations. We generally donate around 40kgs every couple of months, which is most gratefully received.

It is hoped that a Wardens Gift Day will be held in the coming months to enable us to pay the insurance premium for the church and hall, which is estimated to be around £5,000 for 2024. Grade 1 historical buildings are not cheap to maintain, and we are continuing to struggle with finances.

The newly formed Sutton Weaver Community Group are now starting to use the Church Hall more frequently and we really appreciate the financial and practical assistance they are giving towards ensuring this resource remains available in the village.

Never take calls or messages at face value – always take time to stop, think and check if the caller or sender is who they say they are.

If you've received a suspicious call or message:

- don't be rushed into a quick decision think carefully before handing over money, personal details or access to your device.
- if you have any doubts, hang up and do not call the number provided.
- be aware that fraudsters can spoof phone numbers, so the number that appears on your caller ID may not be proof of who they are.
- instead, check with the organisation directly using contact details you know are correct, such as those on a utility bill, official website, on the back of your card or by 159 for banks.
- if you get a message from a family member asking you to send money, use known contact details to check if it's real.

Parking in the Village



The Parish Council continues to receive complaints regarding parking in the village. Parking on pavements forces pedestrians to walk out into the roadway, this is a particular risk for anyone with a pushchair or wheelchair users. Please also consider the possible necessity of emergency vehicles using the roads in the village. Please park responsibly.

Potholes, Overgrown Verges & Hedges, Uneven Footpaths

The Parish Council are aware of these issues and would encourage all members of the community to use the CWaC "Report-it App" which can be downloaded to your smart phone, simply take a picture of the issue and forward to CWaC. The more reports they receive the more likely they are to do something about the issues.

Hedges

The Parish council would like to ask all residents of the village to check your hedges and overhanging trees, and if necessary, cut back now, before birds are nesting, to allow pedestrians ease of use of the footpaths. Hedges and tree's are the landowners responsibility, but we receive many complaints throughout the summer on this subject.

Winter Gritting

The parish council received a number of requests during the short spell of freezing weather in January regarding grit bins. Unfortunately, CWAC no longer supply these, unless to an area of steep incline, of which Sutton Weaver doesn't have.

The Parish council are looking into how to resolve this for next winter. The Clerk has made numerous enquiries, and the parish council will be looking at this again at the end of the summer.



Volunteer Groups

Sutton Weaver Residents Community Group are currently planning some events/activities for 2024 the first one being 'An Easter Egg Hunt' to be held at the Church Hall on Friday 29th March. Children accompanied by an adult are welcome to come and take part to hunt the eggs. There will be prizes for the successful hunters. Refreshments will be available in the Church Hall.



OPERATION PARK SAFE

Operation Park Safe is a new project from cheshire Police which will allow members of the public to report parking issues online.

As part of the scheme, residents will be able to upload videos and photographs of offending vehicles where they will be assessed by an experienced traffic officer, who will triage and deal with any dangerous parking offences.

Any minor traffic obstructions, or community impact issues will be allocated to the local PCSO or Beat officers to deal with in an appropriate manner.

What residents will need to do.

- You will need to provide a written statement about the offence, including the date and time it happened.
- This can be completed electronically.
- You will need to provide us with your name, address, date of birth and contact details.
- You may be required to attend court if the matter is contested.
- Do NOT challenge the driver or get involved in confrontation.
- Do NOT put yourself at risk to obtain a photograph.

What officers will do:

- The Roads and Crime Unit will triage the report and will deal with the person responsible.
- This may include issuing fines or educational courses depending on the severity of the offence committed.

Offences officers will deal with:

- Vehicles parked on or in a crossing area: This includes the area covered by zig-zag lines.
- Parking on white lines: People cannot stop or park on a road marked with double white lines, even when
 a broken white line is on your side of the road, except to pick up or set down passengers, or to load or
 unload goods. This includes the pavement or verge.
- Forcing pedestrians to walk in road: This includes parking on the pavement where there is not enough
 room for pedestrians to get past.
- Parking at/on a junction: Vehicles cannot stop, park opposite or within 10m of a junction.
- School parking offences: People cannot stop or park on the zig-zag lines or keep clear markings.
- · Parking on a cycle track
- Parking a goods vehicle on the road: Vehicles with a maximum laden wight of more than 7.5 tonnes
 (including trailers) cannot park on a verge, pavement or any land situated between carriageways, without
 police permission. The only exception is when this is essential for loading and unloading, but the vehicle
 cannot be left unattended.

What officers can't deal with:

- Single and double yellow line offences: These are local authority parking enforcement only.
- Pavement parking: This is where there is still room for pedestrians to get past without having to go into the road.

How to report

To report please follow the directions below:

Go to www.cheshire.police.uk then to Report a road traffic incident page and find the location on the map.

On the next page press no on "Did at least one vehicle collide with something or someone?"

On the next page click on "A possible driving offence e.g. careless driving, using a mobile phone" and complete the form.
